4th Sunday of Lent, Year A

The opening sentence of Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, in the Documents of the Second Vatican Council, says:

“The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the men of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ. Indeed, nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community composed of men. United in Christ, they are led by the Holy Spirit in their journey to the Kingdom of their Father and they have welcomed the news of salvation which is meant for every man. That is why this community realizes that it is truly linked with mankind and its history by the deepest of bonds.”

Dear brethren, your health and your safety are our primary concern. In the Gospel **rReflection** reading of this fourth Sunday of Lent, liturgically called Laetare (Rejoice), we are invited to see.

The people who surrounded Jesus had their eyes fixed on something else. Because of that they were divided into the following groups:

- **The Disciples:** they began by asking the wrong question: “Who sinned?” We may be inclined to find the culprit, the one who has brought us into this horrible situation.
- **Friends of the man with visual impairments:** can't believe that the same person they knew to be blind can now see. They cannot figure out who he has become, a new creation. They do not believe that people can change. Conversion shocks them.
- **The parents:** kept a distant relationship with their son. “Ask him, he is old enough. They did not want to risk their faith. This man was betrayed by the most important people in his life, those closest and dearest to him.
- **The Pharisees:** because Jesus did this on the sabbath, they were unable to see God's hand in what had occurred.
- **Jesus:** he saw a man created in the image of his father, suffering and in need of redeeming enlightenment. This is because the joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the people of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of his followers.
- **The man who was blind:** But the man himself could see what all this meant. He not only received physical sight, but spiritual sight as well. He, at least, could see that Jesus is from God. And when Jesus meets him after he is thrown out of the synagogue, he believes that Jesus is the Messiah.
- **What about us?** We may recall times in our own situations in which we have been made to see differently. Those were moments of grace. This moment of uncertainty may be one of those situations into which God is asking us to acknowledge our blindness about people, and situations beyond our control that surround us. Through social distancing, Jesus has called us away from everyone else, so he can perform a personal miracle. Faced with this invisible enemy, called Covid-19 pandemic, we are invited to strengthen our bonds of friendship and solidarity. Only in solidarity with all humanity will we be able to see what God may be saying about our blindness. We are all connected. Consequently, we have responsibility for each other. God has given us a bond that cannot be broken: Prayer. Prayer of intercession unites us and strengthens us. Because we are prolife, we will respect the call to social distancing in solidarity with all humanity to protect others who may be at risk.

What can we ask for in Prayer? We must not pray to return to the past. We must pray so that we can move into the future, transformed into the kinds of people God desires for himself, Humanity, that will be cleansed, of spiritual numbness, moral indifference, and of everything else that makes us blind.

May God in his wisdom sustain us with his manifold blessings.

20 de marzo de 2020

¡La paz esté con ustedes, hermanos y hermanas! Durante este tiempo de crisis de salud por el COVID-19, el Señor está con nosotros y nos invita a caminar juntos en la fe. Reconozco que hay miedo y ansiedad en los corazones de muchos. Sin embargo, les insto a que confíen que nuestro Señor está guiando nuestro viaje a través del desierto, así como el pueblo de Israel fue llevado a través de su éxodo a una tierra nueva llena de esperanza.

Mientras caminamos por el desierto, estamos llamados a vivir nuestra fe con sensatez, prudencia y compasión. Después de consultar con varios sacerdotes y líderes laicos, he decidido proporcionar las siguientes directrices, que están sujetas a modificación. Estas deben observarse hasta el 6 de abril y podrían extenderse de ser necesario.

SACRAMENTO DE LA EUCARISTÍA

- A partir del 17 de marzo de 2020, la celebración pública de misas entre semana y los domingos se ha suspendido en la Diócesis de Cheyenne. Las iglesias deben permanecer abiertas durante las horas normales para la oración privada individual. Los fieles estarán exentos de la obligación de asistir a la misa del domingo y los días de obligación mientras la suspensión de las misas públicas esté vigente.
- La Misa diaria puede ser celebrada por el sacerdote sin nadie presente. Si dos o más sacerdotes están en la misma residencia, se espera que celebren la Misa juntos. La Misa diaria no se transmitirá en vivo; sin embargo, los sacerdotes pueden transmitir en vivo una meditación sobre las lecturas.
- La misa dominical puede ser celebrada por el sacerdote con solo dos (2) personas, tales como un servidor y un lector, de la lista de ministros litúrgicos de la parroquia. Las parroquias deben informar a los feligreses de la oportunidad de ver la misa dominical a través de la televisión en vivo, transmisión en vivo por las redes u otras opciones.
- El domingo sigue siendo el día del Señor. Se recomienda encarecidamente a las familias que se reúnan para orar, leer las Sagradas Escrituras, rezar el Rosario, etc. La Diócesis proporcionará recursos en nuestro sitio web Coronavirus (COVID-19) The Living Church in a Time of Crisis. (Una Iglesia viva en tiempos de crisis)

BAUTISMOS, RECONCILIACIÓN Y UNCIÓN DE ENFERMOS

- Estos sacramentos han sido suspendidos, excepto en caso de enfermedad grave o peligro de muerte.
- En este momento de creciente estrés, aislamiento y ansiedad, cada persona debe hacer un examen de conciencia diario y rezar con sinceridad el acto de contrición, los cuales nos brindan el perdón de todos los pecados, incluso "obtiene también el perdón de los pecados mortales, si comprende la firme resolución de recurrir tan pronto sea posible a la confesión sacramental" (Catecismo, #1452).
- Finalmente, si un individuo tiene una necesidad urgente de asesoramiento familiar o una crisis espiritual, debe llamar al sacerdote para recibir orientación.

COMUNIÓN A LOS ENFERMOS Y VISITA A LOS ENFERMOS

- Esta práctica ritual se suspende excepto en peligro de muerte (Viaticum). • Los sacerdotes pueden visitar a los enfermos o confinados en su hogar sólo en caso de emergencia; sin embargo, se les anima a estar en contacto regular por teléfono.
- Todos los fieles deben practicar la caridad mutua con los enfermos y los ancianos, así como con las personas con necesidades financieras debido a la crisis de salud.

CONFIRMACIONES

- La celebración de confirmaciones será pospuesta hasta que termine la crisis de salud. Si es necesario, los pastores podrían ser delegados para celebrar confirmaciones.

FORMACION EN LA FE Y RICA

- Estas clases han sido suspendidas. Contacte a Joe Wotawa Director de Formación Pastoral, para obtener ayuda y recibir materiales de clase a distancia.

VIA CRUCIS Y PRÁCTICAS DE PIEDAD COMUNITARIAS

- Estas han sido suspendidas.

FUNERALES

- Las vigilias de difuntos y las ceremonias de funerales están suspendidas. Si el cementerio local o la funeraria lo permiten, los servicios de entierro se ofrecerán solo con la familia inmediata del difunto (es decir, "El Rito en el cementerio").
 - Puede ofrecerse la posibilidad de la cremación del cuerpo y una vez terminada la crisis de salud realizar el funeral, o una misa en la memoria del difunto puede ser programada para más adelante
- Los pastores deben comunicarse con las funerarias locales y funcionarios del cementerio para aclarar las políticas durante esta crisis.

SEMANA SANTA

- El Triduo Pascual: (jueves y viernes santo, Vigilia Pascual y Domingo de Pascua) se realizará en privado con un máximo de 10 personas, incluidos los sacerdotes. Estos servicios pueden transmitirse en vivo.
- Los ritos de iniciación cristiana que se realizan usualmente en la vigilia pascual pueden programarse para el domingo de Pentecostés o cuando se reanuden las misas comunitarias.
- Según las circunstancias actuales, los sacerdotes pueden celebrar la Vigilia Pascual o el Domingo de Pascua. No tienen que celebrar ambos.

BODAS

- Con urgente necesidad, un matrimonio sin misa se puede celebrar con un máximo de diez (10) personas, incluido el celebrante. Sin esta necesidad, aconseje a las parejas a reprogramar sus bodas.
- Los pastores deben notificar a las parejas que actualmente se están preparando para el matrimonio o que ya han programado bodas. Esta es una situación cambiante y las directivas anteriores pueden modificarse o ampliarse a medida que cambien las circunstancias. Quiero asegurarles a todos los fieles de la Diócesis mis oraciones diarias y mi preocupación por su bienestar y su camino en la fe. Por favor oren por mí. Peace be with you Brothers and Sisters!

During this time of the COVID-19 health crisis, the Lord is with us and inviting us to journey together in faith. I want to acknowledge the fear and anxiety in the hearts of many. Yet, I urge you to be confident that the Lord is guiding our journey in the desert, just as the people of Israel were led through their exodus to a land of new hope.

As we journey in the desert, we must live our faith with reason, prudence, and compassion. After consulting with several priests and lay leaders, I have decided to provide the following directives, which are subject to modification. These are to be observed through April 6, and they may be extended, if necessary.

SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

The public celebration of weekday and Sunday Masses has been suspended in the Diocese of Cheyenne, effective March 17, 2020. Churches are to remain open during normal hours for individual private prayer. The faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Mass while the public celebration of the Mass is suspended.

Daily Mass may be celebrated by the priest with no one present. If two or more priests are in residence, they are expected to celebrate Mass together. Daily Mass will not be livestreamed; however, priests might livestream a meditation on the readings.

Sunday Mass may be celebrated by the priest with only two (2) people, as a server and lector, from the parish's roster of liturgical ministers. Parishes are to inform parishioners of the opportunity to view Sunday Mass either through network television, livestream, or other options.

Sunday is still the Lord's Day. Families are strongly encouraged to gather to pray, read scripture, pray the Rosary, etc. The Diocese will be providing resources on our Coronavirus (COVID-19) The Living Church in a Time of Crisis website.

BAPTISM, RECONCILIATION and ANOINTING OF THE SICK

These Sacraments have been suspended, except for serious illness and danger of death.

In this time of increased stress, isolation, and anxiety each person should make a daily examination of conscience and a sincere Act of Contrition, which obtains forgiveness of all sin, even "mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible" (Catechism, 1452).

Finally, if an individual has an urgent need of family counseling or a spiritual crisis, he or she should call the priest for guidance.

HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE SICK OR HOMEBOUND

This ritual practice is suspended except in danger of death (Viaticum).

Priests may visit the sick or homebound only in emergencies; however, they are encouraged to be in regular contact via telephone.

All the faithful should practice mutual charity to the sick and elderly, as well as to those in financial need because of the health crisis.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmations will be postponed until the health crisis is over. If necessary, pastors may be delegated to confirm.

RCIA and FAITH FORMATION

These classes have been suspended. Contact Director of Pastoral Formation Joe Wotawa for assistance in providing remote class materials.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS and ADORATION

These have been suspended.

FUNERALS

Vigil Services and Funeral Liturgies for the deceased are suspended. If the local cemetery and funeral home agree, burial services will be offered only for the immediate family (i.e., "The Rite of Committal with Final Commendation").

The option for cremation of the body and conducting Funeral Rites after the crisis is over should be offered, or a Memorial Mass may be scheduled at a later date.

Pastors are to contact their local funeral homes and cemetery officials to clarify policies during this crisis.

HOLY WEEK

Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday will occur privately with a maximum of 10 people including the priest(s). These services may be livestreamed.

Holy Saturday initiation rites may be scheduled for Pentecost Sunday or when community Masses resume.

Given the current circumstances, priests may celebrate Holy Saturday Vigil or Easter Sunday. They do not have to celebrate both.

WEDDINGS

Under urgent circumstances, Matrimony without Mass may be celebrated with a maximum of ten (10) people including the celebrant. Otherwise, encourage couples to reschedule their weddings.

Pastors should notify couples who are currently preparing for marriage or have already scheduled weddings.

This is a dynamic situation and the above directives may be modified or extended as circumstances change. I want to assure all the faithful of the Diocese of my daily prayers and concern for your wellbeing and journey of faith. Please pray for me.


