Report from your Parish Pastoral Planning Team

As a review, the task of this Team is to create a Vision, as well as develop Action Plans, for our parish. We are asking the questions: What do we want our parish to look like 10 years from now, 3 years from now, and 1 year from now? And, what do we need to start doing NOW to achieve that Vision?

The Team has now met 4 times over the past two months and has completed a first task of identifying the "current state" of the parish. We have: reviewed a great deal of data from over the past 10 years; completed a "S.W.O.T. Analysis" (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities,



Threats); and, looked at the history of Our Lady of the Mountains, from the 1920's to present. We have also considered goals that the diocese is asking us to consider.

The next task is to use all that data to begin developing Goals and Action Steps for achieving those Goals. However, one other important action was necessary: asking you, all our parishioners, to give us input as to what you think we need to start doing to make our parish better. As you know, we did that over the past few weeks by asking you to fill out those cards during Mass. The response was wonderful! Over 100 of you have provided valuable recommendations!

After collating your comments, as well as all the data analysis we did, we have now identified six "Action Areas" that we will begin to focus on over the coming weeks and months. They are:

Our Lady of the Mountains Action Areas (2021)

- 1. Strong Catholic Youth Ministries
- 2. Grow into One Catholic Community (Anglo & Latino united)
- 3. Our Lady of the Mountains Community (lay persons) more highly engaged in all ministries
- 4. Joyous socialization, sacramental celebrations, outreach, and evangelization
- 5. Powerful, spirit-filled, and high-quality Music Ministry
- 6. Formation for Discipleship ("Metanoia")

The Pastoral Planning Team will now start developing and executing Goals and Action Steps to begin to make each of the "Our Lady of the Mountains Action Items" become reality.

Doers of the Word April 18, Third Sunday of Easter Anything to eat?

The discouraged disciples were in the Upper Room. They had left everything to follow Jesus and now he was gone. Where was He when they needed Him most? Where were they when He needed them most? What were they going to do now.?

Where is God when we need him most? What do grieving people do after the killing of a son, father, brother or friend? Are we behind doors of fear like the disciples, asking what is happening to us as a nation?

Jesus entered the locked doors and spoke of peace. We now know that pain and death are not the last words. On the road to Emmaus two grief-stricken hungry disciples recognize Jesus in the breaking of bread. On the shoreline, one of the disciples recognize Jesus and said, "It's the Lord!" Another disciple jumps into the water to get to Him while Jesus is preparing breakfast for them. He knew they were hungry.

We are hungry for answers. When will the pandemic end? What will we look like afterward? We do not live on bread alone, even with seventy-five varieties to choose from! We are hungry for relationships that do not exploit, friendships that do not betray, and a God who will make all thing new again, even out of senseless tragedies in Minneapolis.

Jesus' cookout and his "any food here" are reassuring. It is another form of his, "I am the bread of life, he who eats this bread will never die."

The Eucharist reminds us of who we are. It reminds us of our basic identity as children of God. We are to follow Him in witnessing to a set of values, stories and heroes different from the secular culture. It is to your great credit that you celebrate the Eucharist. For one hour we stay away from the sports, entertainment and other distractions. There is no "wasting of time" in the House of God. You are here with like-minded people who support you on the path you have chosen. We need this space and time to help us remember who we are: disciples of Jesus, children of God, related to the saints, and a people who should be broken bread in his memory.



I, for one, am glad you're here. It helps me. Thank you.

Hacedores de la Palabra 18 de abril, tercer domingo de Pascua ¿Algo de comer?

Los discípulos desanimados estaban en el Cenáculo. Habían dejado todo para seguir a Jesús y ahora se había ido. ¿Dónde estaba él cuando más lo necesitaban? ¿Qué iban a hacer ahora?

¿Dónde está Dios cuando más lo necesitamos? ¿Qué hacen las personas en duelo después del asesinato de un hijo, padre, hermano o amigo? ¿Estamos detrás de las puertas del miedo como los discípulos, preguntándonos qué nos está pasando como nación?

Jesús entró por las puertas cerradas y habló de paz. Ahora sabemos que el dolor y la muerte no son las últimas palabras. En el camino a Emaús, dos discípulos hambrientos y afligidos reconocen a Jesús en la fracción del pan. En la orilla, uno de los discípulos reconoció a Jesús y dijo: "¡Es el Señor!" Otro discípulo salta al agua para llegar a Él mientras Jesús les prepara el desayuno. Sabía que tenían hambre.

Tenemos hambre de respuestas. ¿Cuándo terminará la pandemia? ¿Cómo nos veremos después? No vivimos solo de pan, jincluso con setenta y cinco variedades para elegir! Estamos hambrientos de relaciones que no exploten, amistades que no traicionen y un Dios que vuelva a hacer todo nuevo, incluso a partir de tragedias sin sentido en Minneapolis.

La comida al aire libre de Jesús y su "comida aquí" son reconfortantes. Es otra forma suya, "Yo soy el pan de vida, el que come de este pan no morirá jamás".

La Eucaristía nos recuerda quiénes somos. Nos recuerda nuestra identidad básica como hijos de Dios. Debemos seguirlo para dar testimonio de un conjunto de valores, historias y héroes diferentes de la cultura secular. Es un gran mérito para usted que celebre la Eucaristía. Durante una hora nos mantenemos alejados de los deportes, el entretenimiento y otras distracciones. No hay "pérdida de tiempo" en la Casa de Dios. Estás aquí con personas de ideas afines que te apoyan en el camino que has elegido. Necesitamos este espacio y tiempo para ayudarnos a recordar quiénes somos: discípulos de Jesús, hijos de Dios, emparentados con los santos, y un pueblo que debería ser el pan partido en su memoria.

Yo, por mi parte, me alegro de que estés aquí. Me ayuda. Gracias.
