Over the last month, I have been in conversation with Fr. Edwin Laude about his desire to return to the Diocese of San Carlos in the Philippines. He has appreciated the time that he has spent here, and he has grown to love the parishioners at Holy Family and Our Lady of the Mountains. Nevertheless, he has discerned that it is time for him to return to his home Diocese of San Carlos. His Visa expires in January 2026, and instead of renewing the Visa, he has decided to depart for the Philippines by January 15, 2026.

He has served with humility, gentleness, and fidelity. He will be missed, and this news will be unsettling for parishioners, especially those who have worked closely with him. I too have grown in friendship with Fr. Edwin, and in anticipation of his departure, I feel a deep sense of loss.

Meanwhile, the question will arise about who is available to serve in his absence. I am working to identify priests to provide coverage as of January 15. It is likely that several priests will assist in providing the necessary pastoral ministry for Our Lady of the Mountains and Holy Family until a new pastor can be named, which will happen by July 2026.

Please understand that there are other challenging pastoral situations that have arisen, and it will take time to discern how to respond to all the needs throughout the Diocese in a systematic way. For example, on September 27-28 in Rock Springs and Eden, it was announced that their pastor has been granted a Leave of Absence for one year, which he had requested. Also, other parishes will need a change in priestly assignments by next July. It will take time to identify priests who are available for the parishes needing new leadership. I will discern carefully in consultation with the Clergy Assignment Council consisting of six priests and two members of the Chancery staff.

Please pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in these matters. At the same time, I want to encourage all of you. Your parishes have many talented and dedicated lay leaders. Your faith communities are vibrant because of your involvement. Your continued participation is critical. Please pray for your priests, deacons, and lay leaders. Know of my prayers for all of you.

Doers of the Word Sunday, October 19, 2025 - 29th OT A Widow, a Judge

The Bible is full of lines saying God hears the cry of the poor, that God is willing to give good things to those who ask. Today's story says that a judge neither "fears God nor respects man."

So, if we see the widow as the image of God, not the judge, then the message becomes clear. Anyone who resists injustice, faces it, names it, and denounces it until right is achieved, is acting as God does.

Powerless as Jesus on the cross who defeats the power of death, the widow achieves victory for right. Through her persistence the widow becomes a kind of Gandhi, a Martin Luther King. Against all odds she will endure until justice is done.

So the parable is not about strategies to wear down God with non-stop prayer, but it's about justice, about us holding self-serving politicians to the truth, working to have children free of violence, uncovering the greed and corruption, improving education, and breaking down barriers that separate people.

A black man and his family were traveling through the South in the 1950's. They stopped to rest a few moments at a park along the highway. His daughters spotted a swing set on a playground in the park and pulled their father toward the swing. They were too young to read the signs that warned that this playground was for "whites only." Sadly but patiently the man told his daughters they could not play there and explained why. This was their first encounter with racism and they burst into tears. So, much as his mother had done for him when he was a child, the man gathered his children into a warm embrace and said to them "Listen, you little girls are somebody. In fact, you are so important and so valuable to God and so powerful that it takes the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the whole state police force to keep you girls off those swings."

So, once more, the judge is anyone who thwarts justice and the woman of our gospel is anyone who acts like God in her pursuit of justice. This woman is formidable. I wonder though: Was she the only one to take on the judge, the one to hunger and third for justice? She shouldn't be. She should have us for company.

Hacedores de la Palabra, Domingo 19 de octubre de 2025 - 29.º AT: Una viuda, un juez

La Biblia está llena de versos que dicen que Dios escucha el clamor de los pobres, que Dios está dispuesto a dar cosas buenas a quienes piden. La historia de hoy dice que un juez no "teme a Dios ni respeta a los hombres".

Así que, si vemos a la viuda como la imagen de Dios, no como el juez, el mensaje queda claro. Quien resiste la injusticia, la enfrenta, la denuncia y la confronta hasta que se haga justicia, actúa como Dios.

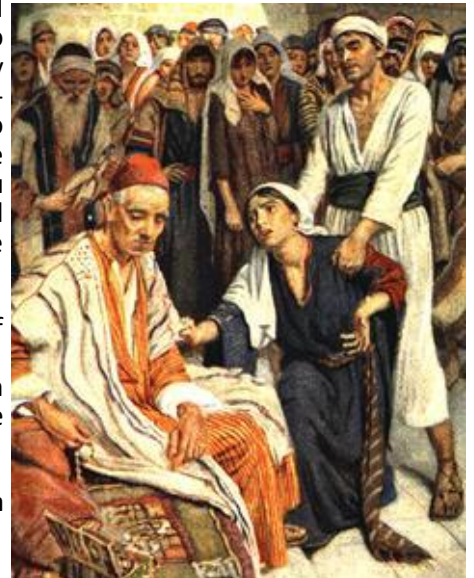
Impotente como Jesús en la cruz, quien vence el poder de la muerte, la viuda logra la victoria por la justicia. Gracias a su persistencia, la viuda se convierte en una especie de Gandhi, un Martin Luther King. Contra todo pronóstico, perseverará hasta que se haga justicia.

Así que la parábola no trata sobre estrategias para desgastar a Dios con oraciones incesantes, sino sobre justicia, sobre cómo exigirle la verdad a los políticos egoístas, trabajar para tener hijos libres de violencia, descubrir la avaricia y la corrupción, mejorar la educación y derribar las barreras que separan a las personas.

Un hombre negro y su familia viajaban por el sur en la década de 1950. Se detuvieron a descansar unos momentos en un parque junto a la carretera. Sus hijas vieron un columpio en un área de juegos del parque y jalaban a su padre hacia el columpio. Eran demasiado pequeñas para leer los letreros que advertían que ese área era "solo para blancos". Con tristeza, pero con paciencia, el hombre les dijo a sus hijas que no podían jugar allí y les explicó por qué. Este fue su primer encuentro con el racismo y rompieron a llorar. Así que, tal como su madre lo había hecho cuando era niño, el hombre abrazó a sus hijas con cariño y les dijo: «Escuchen, ustedes, niñas, son alguien. De hecho, son tan importantes y valiosas para Dios, y tan poderosas, que se necesita al gobernador, al vicegobernador y a toda la policía estatal para mantenerlas alejadas de esos columpios».

Así que, una vez más, el juez es cualquiera que obstruye la justicia, y la mujer de nuestro evangelio es cualquiera que actúa como Dios en su búsqueda de la justicia.

Esta mujer es formidable. Sin embargo, me pregunto: ¿Fue ella la única que se enfrentó al juez, la que anhelaba la justicia y la tercera que la buscaba? No debería serlo. Debería tenernos como compañía.

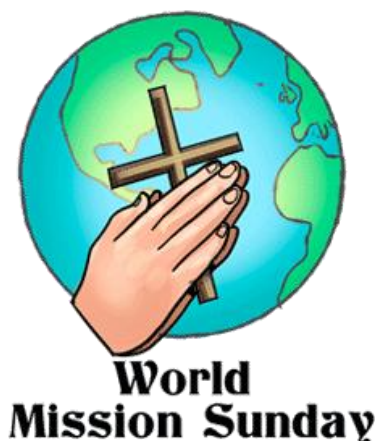

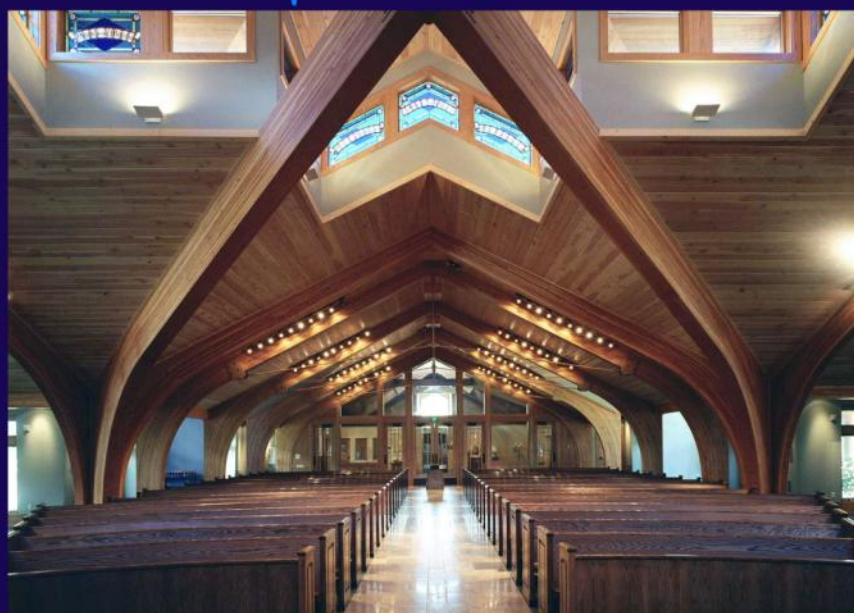
